#### **Attendance**

This Term we have started strong with our attendance data. The graph on the side demonstrates our improved attendance rate. If you are planning a holiday during school time, this leave needs to be approved by the Principal. The office staff can provide you with the form to fill out and the requirements needed when applying. It is also important that when your child is away, we have an explained absence that can be justified according to the reasonable absences that the Department of Education's stipulates. Unfortunately, some absences may be explained, however, they will remain unjustified as they didn't met the criteria. Things like I stayed at home because it was my birthday is unfortunately an unjustified absence. At the end of this newsletter there is an explanation of justified and unjustified reasons for absences.

## **Attendance Awards**

The students who have achieved 90 or above attendance will be recognised and rewarded during week 11. To achieve this rate of attendance the student has had less than 5 days away for the term. If you are at school 90% or more means you are not missing vital instruction in English and Numeracy.

#### **Communication**

This is just a friendly reminder that your first port of call for communication is your child's class teacher. Often, I may not have all the information and will have to defer back to the class teacher for more information. If you are not satisfied with the communication or outcomes from your child's class teacher, then reach out to the Stage AP, they will be able to meet with you to discuss your concerns and help to get a smooth resolution.

We wish you all a safe holiday and for those who celebrate Easter we hope this time is a wonderful celebration for you. Looking forward to seeing you all after the break.


